FOR YOUR SAFETY

SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

WARNING

STOP OPERATING THE MONITOR WHEN YOU SENSE TROUBLE

If you notice any abnormal phenomena such as smoke, strange sounds or fumes, unplug the monitor and contact your dealer or iiyama service center immediately. Further use may be dangerous and can cause fire or electric shock.

NEVER REMOVE THE CABINET

High voltage circuits are inside the monitor. Removing the cabinet may expose you to the danger of fire or electric shock.

DO NOT PUT ANY OBJECT INTO THE MONITOR

Do not put any solid objects or liquids such as water into the monitor. In case of an accident, unplug your monitor immediately and contact your dealer or iiyama service center. Using the monitor with any object inside may cause fire, electric shock or damage.

INSTALL THE MONITOR ON A FLAT, STABLE SURFACE

The monitor may cause an injury if it falls or is dropped.

DO NOT USE THE MONITOR NEAR WATER

Do not use where water may be splashed or spilt onto the monitor as it may cause fire or electric shock.

OPERATE UNDER THE SPECIFIED POWER SUPPLY

Be sure to operate the monitor only with the specified power supply. Use of an incorrect voltage will cause malfunction and may cause fire or electric shock.

PROTECT THE CABLES

Do not pull or bend the power cable and signal cable. Do not place the monitor or any other heavy objects on the cables. If damaged, the cables may cause fire or electric shock.

ADVERSE WEATHER CONDITIONS

It is advisable not to operate the monitor during a heavy thunder storm as the continual breaks in power may cause malfunction. It is also advised not to touch the plug in these circumstances as it may cause electric shock.

CAUTION

INSTALLATION LOCATION

Do not install the monitor where sudden temperature changes may occur, or in humid, dusty or smoky areas as it may cause fire, electric shock or damage. You should also avoid areas where the sun shines directly on the monitor.

DO NOT PLACE THE MONITOR IN A HAZARDOUS POSITION

The monitor may topple and cause injury if not suitably located. Please also ensure that you do not place any heavy objects on the monitor, and that all cables are routed such that children may not pull the cables and possibly cause injury.

CAUTION

MAINTAIN GOOD VENTILATION

Ventilation slots are provided to keep the monitor from overheating. Covering the slots may cause fire. To allow adequate air circulation, place the monitor at least 10cm (or 4 inches) from any walls. When removing the tilt stand, the ventilation slots on the back side of the monitor can be blocked.

This may overheat the monitor and may cause fire or damage. Make sure to allow enough ventilation when removing the tilt stand. Operating the monitor on its back, side, upside down or on a carpet or any other soft material may also cause damage.

DISCONNECT THE CABLES WHEN YOU MOVE THE MONITOR

When you move the monitor, turn off the power switch, unplug the monitor and be sure the signal cable is disconnected. If you do not disconnect them, it may cause fire or electric shock.

UNPLUG THE MONITOR

If the monitor is not in use for a long period of time it is recommended that it is left unplugged to avoid accidents.

HOLD THE PLUG WHEN DISCONNECTING

To disconnect the power cable or signal cable, always pull it by the plug. Never pull on the cable itself as this may cause fire or electric shock.

DO NOT TOUCH THE PLUG WITH WET HANDS

Pulling or inserting the plug with wet hands may cause electric shock.

WHEN YOU INSTALL THE MONITOR ON YOUR COMPUTER

Be sure the computer is strong enough to hold the weight of the monitor, otherwise, you may damage your computer.

REMARK FOR 24/7 USAGE

This product is not specifically designed for 24/7 usage in all environments.

REMARK SPECIFIC TO DESKTOP USE

This product is designed for desktop use, not for digital signage (electronic signboard) applications such as ceiling hanging or wall mounting.

DO NOT TILT THE MONITOR DOWNWARD TOO FAR

To avoid potential screen damage such as LCD panel peeling from the bezel, ensure that the monitor does not tilt downward beyond its adjustable range.

DO NOT USE ALCOHOL OR DISINFECTANTS ON THE MONITOR

Do not spray alcohol or disinfectants directly onto the monitor or use them near the monitor. Also, do not wipe the monitor with a cloth or sheet that contains alcohol or disinfectants. These may cause discoloration, deterioration, or cracking of the cabinet, damage to the surface treatment of the LCD panel, and deterioration of components.

OTHERS

ERGONOMIC RECOMMENDATIONS

To eliminate eye fatigue, do not operate the monitor against a bright background or in a dark room. For optimal viewing comfort, the monitor should be just below eye level and 40-60 cm (16-24 inches) away from your eyes. When using the monitor over a prolonged time, a ten minute break every hour is recommended as looking at the screen continuously can cause eye strain.

SPECIAL NOTES ON LCD MONITORS

The following symptoms are normal with LCD monitors and do not indicate a problem.

- **NOTE** When you first turn on the LCD monitor, the picture may not fit in the display area because of the type of computer that is used. In this case, adjust the picture position to the correct position.
 - You may find slightly uneven brightness on the screen depending on the desktop pattern you use.
 - Due to the nature of the LCD screen, an afterimage of the previous screen may remain after switching the image, when the same image is displayed for hours. In this case, the screen can be recovered slowly by changing the image or turning off the Power Switch for some hours.

CUSTOMER SERVICE

NOTE If you have to return your unit for service and the original packaging has been discarded, please contact your dealer or iiyama service center for advice or replacement packaging.



WARNING If you drop any materials or liquids such as water into the monitor when cleaning, unplug the power cable immediately and contact your dealer or iiyama service center.

For safety reasons, turn off the power switch and unplug the monitor before you clean it.

CAUTION

NOTE

- Do not spray alcohol or disinfectants directly onto the monitor or use them near the monitor. Also, do not wipe the monitor with a cloth or sheet that contains alcohol or disinfectants. - To protect the LCD panel, do not scratch or rub the screen with a hard object.
- Do not leave the LCD panel wet. If water droplets or the like get on it, immediately wipe it off with a dry, soft cloth. Leaving it on may cause discoloration or stains on the LCD panel. In addition, if moisture gets inside the monitor, it may cause damage.
- Touching the cabinet with any product made from rubber or plastic for a long time may cause degeneration or loss of paint on the cabinet.

Regular care Gently wipe the cabinet with a soft, dry and clean cloth. If your monitor is particularly dirty, soak the cloth in a mild detergent thoroughly diluted with water, wring it out tightly, and then wipe the dirt off. Then immediately wipe it with a soft, dry cloth.

Alcohol disinfection Alcohol disinfection may cause discoloration, deterioration, or cracking of the cabinet, damage to the surface treatment of the LCD panel, and deterioration of components. Instead, we recommend disinfecting your hands away from the monitor before and after use.

If you absolutely must disinfect the monitor with alcohol, please understand above warnings and cautions in advance. Also, avoid frequent alcohol disinfection.



USING ARM OR STAND


CAUTION

- This product is designed for desktop use, not for digital signage (electronic signboard) applications such as ceiling hanging or wall mounting.
- Before installation, make sure the display arm or desk arm stand is strong enough to hold the necessary weight of the monitor and the mount.
- The monitor angle should be within 22° upward and 4° downward. This product cannot be used facing upward or downward beyond this range.
- If the monitor is used (installed) at an angle more than 4° downward, the LCD may peel off from the bezel and fall, resulting in damage. In addition, such cases will not be covered by support or warranty.




[DISPLAY ARM OR DESK ARM STAND]

CAUTION When you use with the display arm or desk arm stand, in consideration of thickness of the mounting stage, tighten the M4 Screws (4pcs) which "L" length is 7mm to fasten the monitor. Using the screw longer than this may cause electric shock or damage because it may contact with the electrical parts inside the monitor.

The monitor is designed to be compatible in landscape mode.




FITTING AND REMOVAL OF BASE

- **CAUTION** Put the monitor on a stable surface. The monitor may cause injury or damage if it falls or is dropped.
 - Do not give a strong impact to the monitor. It may cause damage.
 - Unplug the monitor before removal or installation to avoid an electric shock or a damage.

<Installation>

- ① As shown below, place all the contents taken out from the carton box on a flat surface with the monitor front face down.
- (2) Take off the rear cushion, Stand-Neck, Stand-Base, and Cable-Holder.




③ Place the Cable Holder.



NOTE The cable holder cannot be removed after installation.


④ Hold the monitor and install the Stand-Neck to the monitor until it clicks to secure.



⑤ Use the 'thumb screw' provided to secure the Stand-Base to the Stand-Neck.




(6) Stand the monitor and then remove the front cushion.




<Removal>

- ① Put the front cushion on a flat surface and place the monitor with face down on it.
- (2) Loosen the 'thumb screw' to remove the Stand-Base from the Stand-Neck.
- ③ Press the hook on the back of the monitor and remove the Stand-Neck from the monitor.


CONNECTING YOUR MONITOR

- 1 Ensure that both the computer and the monitor are switched off.
- ② Connect the computer to the monitor with the signal cable.
- ③ Connect the computer to the monitor with the USB Cable.
- ④ Connect the Power Cable to the monitor first and then to the power source.
- (5) Turn on your monitor and computer.

NOTE Make sure that the building installation has a circuit breaker of 120/240V, 20A (maximum).


- The signal cables used for connecting the computer and monitor may vary with the type of computer used. An incorrect connection may cause serious damage to both the monitor and the computer. The cable supplied with the monitor is for a standard connector. If a special cable is required please contact your local iiyama dealer or regional iiyama office.
- The Class I pluggable equipment Type A must be connected to protective earth.
- The socket-outlet shall be installed near the equipment and shall be easily accessible.
- Excessive sound pressure from ear-/headphones can cause hearing damage/hearing loss.



Signal Timing

Change to the desired signal timing listed on page 29: COMPLIANT TIMING.

ADJUSTING THE VIEWING ANGLE

- For optimal viewing it is recommended to look at the full face of the monitor.
- Hold the stand so that the monitor does not topple when you change the monitor's angle.
- You are able to adjust the monitor's angle up to 22° upward, 4° downward.
- In order to ensure a healthy and relaxed body position when using the monitor at visual display workstations, it is recommended that the adjusted tilt angle should not exceed 10°. Adjust the monitor's angle to your own preference.
- NOTE
- Do not touch the LCD screen when you change the angle. It may cause damage or break the LCD screen.
- Careful attention is required not to pinch your fingers or hands into the moving part of the stand when you change the angle.



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OPERATING THE MONITOR

To create the best picture, your iiyama LCD monitor has been preset at the factory with the COMPLIANT TIMING shown on page 29. You are also able to adjust the picture by following the button operation shown below.

① Press the Navigation Button to start the On Screen Display feature.



- ② Tilting the Navigation ◀ / ► Buttons to select the Menu which contains the item you want to adjust or set and then press the Navigation Button.
- ③ Tilting the Navigation ▲ / ▼ Buttons to highlight the desired adjustment / setting icon and then press the Navigation Button.
- ④ Tilting the Navigation ◀ / ▶ Buttons to make the appropriate adjustment or setting and then press the Navigation Button.
- (5) Tilting the Navigation ◀ Button to leave the menu, and the settings you just made would be automatically saved.

For example, to correct for OSD vertical position, select Menu item of Setup Menu and then press the Navigation Button. Then, select OSD Vertical Position by tilting the Navigation \blacktriangle / \blacksquare Buttons. An adjustment page appears after you press the Navigation Button.

Then, tilting the Navigation \triangleleft / \blacktriangleright Buttons to change the OSD vertical position settings. The OSD vertical position of the overall display should be changing accordingly while you are doing this.



Standby Mode

When the video signal from the computer is off, the monitor enters into Standby Mode which reduces the power consumption to less than 0.5W*. The screen becomes dark, and the power indicator turns to orange. From Standby Mode, the image reappears in several seconds when either the keyboard or the mouse are touched again.


